## Lesson 5: Practise Opener New Suit Rebids and continuations

Print off and fold down the middle.

1	West Pass	North 1NT	<b>East</b> Pass	South 1 A	<ul><li>AK872</li><li>✓ J752</li><li>✓ KQ7</li><li>♣ 6</li></ul>	Your shape is unsuitable for No Trumps and partner's dustbin 1NT could be unbalanced. Your bid of 2♥ promises 5+ spades, 4+ hearts and 12-18 points.
2	West Pass	North 1♥	<b>East</b> Pass	South  1 ◆ ?	<ul><li>A A 5</li><li>▼ 75</li><li>◆ A K J 6 5</li><li>♣ A K 9 6</li></ul>	You have 19 HCP, enough for game even if partner has a bare minimum 6 points. You must show your clubs. A bid of 2* would show 12-18 HCP which partner might pass. Your jump bid of 3* shows 19+ points, at least 5 diamonds and at least 4 clubs Partner must bid again.
3	West Pass	North 1 ♣	<b>East</b> Pass	South  1 ♥ ?	<ul><li>★ K5</li><li>▼ AK872</li><li>◆ KQ72</li><li>♣ QJ</li></ul>	You have 18 points but must not bid 3, which would show 19 points and would be game forcing. Partner might have just 6 points and no support for either of your suits and a hand unsuitable for No Trumps. A non-jump rebid in a suit that is lower ranking than your first suit has a wide point range – 12-18 points
4	West Pass	North 1♥ 2♥	East Pass Pass	South 2* ?	<ul><li>♣ 4</li><li>♥ AJ7</li><li>◆ KJ43</li><li>♣ QJ652</li></ul>	Partner's rebid has shown that he has 5+ hearts and 12-18 points. You have an 8+ card heart fit and enough points for game (12 HCP + 3 shortage points).
5	West Pass	North 1♠ 2♥	East Pass Pass	South 2 * ?	<ul><li>♠ 65</li><li>♥ J84</li><li>♦ A32</li><li>♣ KJ652</li></ul>	With just 6-9 points you have to give preference to one of partner's suits. A rebid of 2NT would show 10-12 points. A preference bid does not necessarily show 3 card support. A 5-2 trump suit fit will usually play better than a 4-3 trump suit fit because declarer is less likely to lose control of trumps. On a good day partner will have 6 spades.
6	West	North 1.4.	East Pass Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>★ K943</li><li>♥ AK75</li><li>◆ 743</li><li>♣ J6</li></ul>	3♠ With 11 points and an 8+ card spade fit you jump to 3♠ showing an invitational hand (10-12 points). With 6-9 points you would sign off in 2♠ With 13 points you would jump to 4♠.
7	West	North 1 ◆ 2 ♣	East Pass Pass	South 1 ♥ ?	<ul><li>♠ 972</li><li>♥ KJ6432</li><li>♦ 8</li><li>♣ K82</li></ul>	With 6 reasonable hearts you repeat them at the lowest level showing 6-9 points. You must not rebid your suit if it's a poor 6 card suit or with any 5 card suit. Opener has shown at least 5-4 in his two bid suits so may have only one card (or none!) in your suit.

8	West Pass	North  1 * 1 *	Pass Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>♠ 976</li><li>♥ Q965</li><li>♦ A52</li><li>♣ J64</li></ul>	1NT With the stopper in diamonds and flat shape with nothing to ruff, making 8 tricks in No Trumps will score better than making 8 tricks in a club contract (scoring 120 vs 90)
9	West Pass	North 1♠ 2♥	East Pass Pass	South 2 * ?	<ul><li>↑ 76</li><li>♥ K94</li><li>↑ AQ3</li><li>↑ A9865</li></ul>	You have 13 points, enough for game, and you have a good stopper* in the unbid suit (diamonds), so can bid 3NT.  * "Stopper": If you end up playing in No Trumps you will be declarer, so if West leads the unbid diamond suit round to your DAQ you will win the first two rounds of diamonds, i.e. you have two diamond stoppers.
10	West Pass	North 1* 1*	East Pass Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>★ K982</li><li>♥ K954</li><li>◆ 765</li><li>♣ J5</li></ul>	A minimum raise of partner's spade suit shows 6-9 points and four spades. With 10 points you would have bid 3.
11	West Pass	North 1 ◆ 2 ♣	Pass Pass	South  1♥ ?	<ul><li>★ K976</li><li>♥ K942</li><li>◆ 7</li><li>♣ 6542</li></ul>	Pass  Opener has 5+ diamonds and 4+ clubs. He has not rebid 1♠ or supported your hearts so has denied 4 hearts and 4 spades. He has 12-18 HCP (with 19 HCP he would have jumped to 3♣). It is very unlikely that the partnership has enough combined points for game, so you want to settle for a safe part score. You have an 8+ card club fit so you pass. This is called a <b>preference pass</b> , preferring partner's clubs.
12	West	North 1 ♦ 2 ♣	East Pass Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>♠ QJ2</li><li>♥ AK10763</li><li>♦ J2</li><li>♣ 65</li></ul>	3♥ Your jump rebid of your suit shows an intermediate level responder hand (10-12) and at least 6 hearts.
13	West Pass	North 1 ◆ 2 ♣	East Pass Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>★ KJ2</li><li>▼ AKJ10953</li><li>◆ 72</li><li>♣ 6</li></ul>	You have opening values and your hand can deliver at least 6 tricks in hearts even if partner has no hearts. Partner has opened the bidding so you can confidently bid game in hearts.
14	West Pass	North 1NT	<b>East</b> Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>AK43</li><li>✓ AK852</li><li>✓ 5</li><li>♣ QJ3</li></ul>	You have 17 points so are strong enough to show your spades. This bid is known as <b>a reverse</b> .
15	West	North 1♥	<b>East</b> Pass	South  1  ?	<ul><li>AKQ2</li><li>♥ 9</li><li>▶ J8763</li><li>♣ AK2</li></ul>	Your second suit is higher ranking than your first suit, but is not a reverse because it is not a level higher than your first bid, so shows 12-18 points
16	West Pass	North 1NT	<b>East</b> Pass	South  1  ?	<ul><li>AKJ2</li><li>✓ 2</li><li>✓ KJ763</li><li>✓ K92</li></ul>	You have 15 HCP, not enough to reverse by bidding 2.
