## Lesson 3: Practise Limit Bid Responses and Opener's Continuations

Print off and fold down the middle.

1 West North East South 1 Pass ?	<ul><li>♠ AK8</li><li>♥ 8752</li><li>♦ 92</li><li>♣ K872</li></ul>	You have four card heart support, 10 HCP points and one shortage point (diamond doubleton) so with 11 total points you have an intermediate strength responder hand. With the same shape and 6-9 points you would bid 2♥.
2 West North East South 1♠ Pass ?	<ul><li>A AK72</li><li>♥ 9865</li><li>♦ 82</li><li>♣ J98</li></ul>	You have 4 card spade support, 8 HCP and one shortage point (doubleton). That is a minimum responder hand, so you make a simple (non-jump) raise to 2. With one more point you would bid 3.
3 West North East South 1 ♥ Pass ?	<ul><li>♠ QJ98</li><li>♥ J1072</li><li>♠ A7</li><li>♣ KQ9</li></ul>	You have a fit for North's hearts and 13 points, which is a strong responder hand. You know that the partnership has at least 25 points so you bid game.
4 West North East South 1 Pass 2 Pass 3 Pass ?	<ul><li>★ K983</li><li>♥ A5</li><li>◆ J972</li><li>♣ 876</li></ul>	You have 9 points (including one shortage point) so your first response is a simple 2 , which shows a minimum strength hand and a spade fit. Partner's rebid of 3 is an invitational bid that shows interest in game (4 in provided you are at the top end of your 6-9 points. You accept the invitation.
5 West North East South 1 ♥ Pass 3 ♥ Pass ?	<ul><li>♣ A765</li><li>♥ KJ82</li><li>◆ AK3</li><li>♣ J3</li></ul>	Partner's jump to 3 v shows an intermediate responder hand (10-12 points). You have 17 points including shortage, an intermediate opener's hand, so, knowing that the partnership has at least 27 points, you bid game.
6 West North East South  Pass 2♥ Pass ?	<ul><li>♣ AJ3</li><li>♥ KQ9632</li><li>◆ 4</li><li>♣ KJ4</li></ul>	Partner has shown 6-9 points and heart support. You have an intermediate strength hand, 17 points including three shortage points (singleton diamond) and want to know whether partner is at the top or bottom end of her range. Your 3 rebid invites partner to bid game with 8-9 points or to pass with 6-7 points.
7 West North East South 1 Pass ?	<ul><li>♠ A9874</li><li>♥ -</li><li>♦ KJ987</li><li>♣ J96</li></ul>	You have 9 high card points (HCP) but you have great spade support and can add five shortage points for the void in hearts. With 14 total points opposite North's minimum 12 points you bid game.
8 West North East South 1 ♥ Pass ?	<ul><li>AQ9</li><li>♥ 954</li><li>♦ J765</li><li>♣ A96</li></ul>	You have 11 HCP. A bid of 2NT shows 10-12 HCP and a balanced hand. Swap the ♥9 for ♥Q and with a 13 HCP balanced hand you would bid 3NT.

9	West Pass	North 1NT	<b>East</b> Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>♠ AK9</li><li>♥ J954</li><li>♦ J76</li><li>♣ AK6</li></ul>	Pass  Partner has shown 6-9 points. You have 16 HCP. Although it is just possible that partner has 9 HCP, enough for game, he is more likely to have 6 or 7 HCP. The percentage action is to pass.
10	West Pass	North 1NT	East Pass	South  1 • ?	<ul><li>♠ AK</li><li>♥ J954</li><li>◆ QJ65</li><li>♣ AK6</li></ul>	Partner has shown 6-9 points. You have 18 HCP. Although it is just possible that partner has just 6 HCP, enough for game, he is more likely to have 7-9 HCP, enough for game. Your bid is inviting partner to bid 3NT if he is at the upper end of the 6-9 HCP range. If he passes then 2NT has good chances.
11	West Pass	North 1NT	<b>East</b> Pass	South 1♥ ?	<ul><li>AK</li><li>✓ J954</li><li>✓ KJ65</li><li>AK6</li></ul>	Partner has shown 6-9 points. You have 19 HCP. The partnership has at least 25 HCP so you bid game.
12	West Pass	North 2 &	East Pass	South  1.4. ?	<ul><li>♠ A3</li><li>♥ J95</li><li>♦ KJ6</li><li>♣ AK632</li></ul>	Pass  You have a balanced hand and 16 HCP. If partner had bid a new suit, a wide-ranging bid that could have opening values or more, then you would have bid 1NT, and if partner had bid a dustbin 1NT (6-9 HCP) then you would have passed. Partner has shown 6-9 HCP so your chances of making game are very slim. Even 2NT could be too high.
13	West Pass	North 2 ♣	<b>East</b> Pass	South  1.* ?	<ul><li>★ K3</li><li>♥ KJ5</li><li>◆ AJ6</li><li>♣ AQ632</li></ul>	You have a balanced hand and 18 HCP. Unlike the previous example (Q.13), you are now strong enough to make an invitational bid of 2NT, asking partner to pass with 6 or 7 HCP or to bid on with 8-9 HCP.
